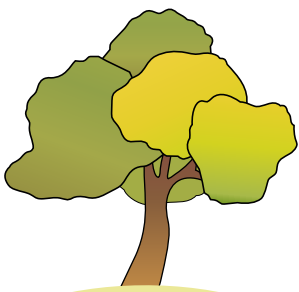

We were able to have regular project visits and organize polio/blood donation/health camps. Besides our ongoing community service projects, we undertook several new initiatives such as organizing Covid-19 Vaccination Camp, Donation of two Dialysis Machines to Rotary Dialysis Centre, Donation of Blankets and warm clothes at slums of Srinivaspuri, provide clean drinking water in schools. In addition, we supported e-learning, computer literacy, toilet renovation/upgradation projects and installed hand wash facilities at SDMC/Govt. schools in Delhi, NCR under District 3011 WinS & WASH in schools. Under T-E-A-C-H, we supported RILM Program – Asha Kiran. We also opened a new Skill Development Centre (Computer Learning) at Rani Bagh & continued to run the vocational centre at South Extn., Gurugram & Noida. The Inter-School Extempore English Debating Competition was a great success. In our endeavor to fight against Covid, our Club organized three Covid Vaccination Camps; supported 'Feed the Needy' program by AGWO; supported St. Stephen's Hospital & ESI Hospital to upgrade their Pediatric Covid ward.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Rotary Club of Delhi Garden City has been involved in a number of community service projects. In 2020-21, we not only sustained these ongoing projects but launched a number of new initiatives. A brief of these projects and initiatives can be found below:

Basti Vikas Kendra, Srinivaspuri Slum Cluster

This pre-nursery, inaugurated in 1999, is situated on the periphery of a big slum in Srinivaspuri in the heart of South Delhi. Children of casual daily laborers leave their 3–6-year-old children in the school for a full day's care. Children are provided primary education, mid-day meal, uniforms, toys, medical checkup, etc. There are 60 children in this *Balwadi*. We renovated the school by fixing tiles in the rooms, getting new furniture for the children, fencing, painting, polishing, etc. The school has also been supplied sports equipment for the kids. RCDGC provides for teachers, maids/cooks, infrastructure maintenance and teaching supplies.



Recently, we made the infrastructural improvement by providing Study Desks; Coolers; Inverter; Exhaust Fans and Music System. This year we also initiated some repairs and infrastructure improvement and repaired the ceiling as the Balwadi was opened on March 2nd, 2022 after 2 years due to the lockdown. We also installed separate water storage tank. Also renovated/painted the place to give clean and happy environment to the tiny tots. Including our own water connection and power connection. This project was also awarded **Significant Achievement Award** by Rotary International in 2008-09.

Skill Development Centre (Vocational Centre)

This project, started in our Silver Jubilee year, caters to the women in the economically weaker section of society. This year we started one more Skill Development Centre with 'Computer Learning' at Rani Bagh. You will be pleased to learn that at present we are running four RCDGC Skill Development Centre's

We hope this vocational centre will be a great success for the poor ladies and their children.

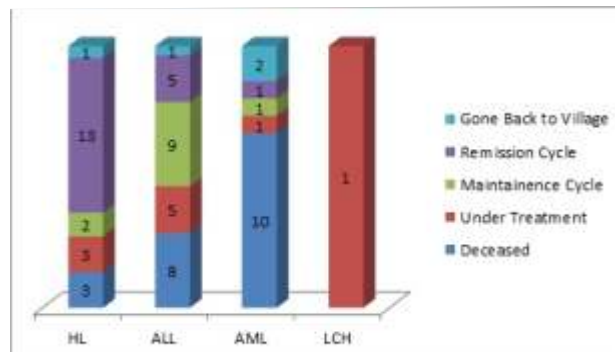
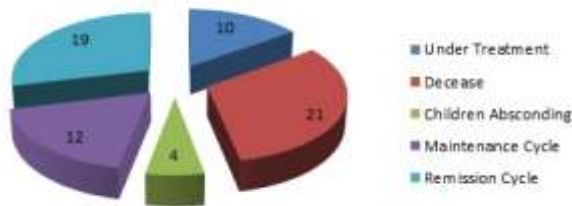


These ladies will enhance their talent from this sewing centre which will enable them to earn their livelihood and sustain themselves.

Pulse Polio & End Polio Drive

Rotary has dedicated itself to worldwide eradication of Polio due largely to Rotary's efforts; India was declared polio free by the WHO in February 2014. Our Club RCDGC continues to actively participate in the Polio plus National Immunization Days (NID's) in Delhi where we are responsible for logistics support in the area. In the past seven years, our Club has been allotted two booths, one at Hamid Poly Clinic, Batla House, Okhla and another at Lions Hospital, Khijrabad. On NID/SNIDs our members visited both localities, going house to house encouraging parents to bring their children to the booths for vaccination. Plastic balls, caps, chocolate, biscuits etc. were distributed to motivate the children and increase the turnout. Members monitored the booths and administered polio drops.



Covid Vaccination Camps: We held 3 Covid Vaccination Camps and administered 3012 jabs in association with Hope Oncology Clinic and Learning by Locals.

- August 6th Govt. School Harkesh Nagar, Okhla – Ph 2 and administered 977 vaccinations
- August 28th Govt. School, Tehkhand, Okhla – Ph 1 and administered 990 vaccinations
- September 19th Govt. School Harkesh Nagar, Okhla – Ph 2 and administered 1045 vaccinations

Thanks to Mr. Aditya from Hope Oncology Clinic for providing Medical Services like Doctors, Nursing Staff and Vaccination. Thanks to Rtn. Monica Kumar for facilitating this contact and also supported food & refreshments during the camp. A big thanks to R'Anne Bibi Rani for the smooth operations of the camps with the volunteers from Learning by Locals doing all efforts and ground work for these camps.



Donation to Rotary Dialysis Centre: RCDGC donated Two Dialysis Machines to Rotary Dialysis Centre at Rotary Blood Bank – Gurugram. Thanks to Rtn. Chirag Jain for the donation for the noble cause.



Donation to St. Stephens Hospital: Club donated Rs. 6.00 lacs to support St. Stephens Hospital to setup Pediatric Covid Ward to purchase “Multi-Modality Monitors and “Syringe Pumps” to strengthen its medical infrastructure.

Donation to ESI Hospital: Donated “Neo puff Machine” for Neonatal ICU and “Infusion Pumps” (Two in Number), to ESI Hospital, Jhilmil Colony to be used for COVID patients in the Pediatric COVID-19 ward.



Blanket Distribution: Club organized two camps and donated 490 sets of blankets; warm caps and socks at the slums of Srinivaspuri.

Health Camp: RCDGC organized a health camp in association with 'Swadeshi Jagran Manch' and Fortis Hospital Faridabad, where we provided free tests of BP, Sugar, BDM, PFI and ECG. A total of 96 registrations were done for this camp.

Feed the Needy: In association with AGWO, daily (Monday – Friday) cooked meal was distributed in slums of Noida & Srinivaspuri and almost 150 – 180 children were provided food on a daily basis.

Webinar on Breast Cancer Awareness: Our club jointly hosted Seminar on Breast Cancer Awareness, with Rotary District 3011. The program was started with Inaugural speech by Rtn. Anup Mittal, Dist. Governor, RI 3011. Guest speaker(s) were Dr Amish Vora from Hope Oncology Clinic and Dr. Asit Arora from Max, Saket. Rotary members from various club in the district also attended the program.



Other Past Projects:

E-Learning Equipment: E-Classrooms: Rotary International launched an initiative to eradicate another demon from our society '**Illiteracy**'. Rotary took this initiative under its flagship mission **T-E-A-C-H** that aims to ensure basic education for under privileged children across India.


The five pillars of **Rotary's Literacy Mission** are:

- T – Teacher Support**
- E – E-Learning for School Children**
- A – Adult Literacy**
- C – Child Development**
- H – Happy Schools**

Out of these five pillars, District 3011 has undertaken **E-Learning** to ensure the optimum use of technology to remove **Illiteracy** from our country. The District approached **Egate Infotel Pvt.Ltd.** for e-learning solutions in schools and negotiated the best price for e-equipment.

This year we supported Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM) Program Asha Kiran a ray of hope, A program is to bring /send out of school children back to schools, with Rs. 15.00 lacs. The funds for the same were donated under CSR funds by our own member Rtn. Chirag Jain's company.





Support for autistic children at Tamana, School of Hope: Our Club have been supporting Tamana for many years. In year 2019-20 we supported by setting up a **waste paper recycling unit** at a cost of Rs. 10.00 lacs. The program enables the differently abled children to realize their full potential, instills self confidence in them and helps in their social and economic integration. In 2018-19 our Club supported *Tamana* and built an *occupational/physiotherapy room* by spending Rs. 5.00 lakhs. Prior to that we contributed Rs. 2.50 lakhs to build an *auditorium* and in year 2016-17 our club contributed Rs. 4.65 lakhs for a *sensory room* for the autistic children at the Autism Centre.

Project Prakash: This project funds operations of children who are blind since child birth. In association with *Dr. Shroff Charity Eye Hospital*, surgeries are performed at a subsidized rate of Rs. 20,000/- per eye. Our Club has been involved with *Project Prakash* since 2013-14 when we donated Rs. 3.00 lakhs. In 2014-15 Rs.5 lakhs was given. In 2017-18 we contributed Rs. 3.50 lakhs. In 2018-19 we contributed Rs. 6.05 lakhs. In 2019-20 we contributed Rs. 2.20 lacs. In year 2020-21 we contributed Rs. 1.25 lacs. Thanks to all the donors & PP Rtn. Sundeeep Khanna for coordinating with Dr. Shroff Charity Eye Hospital.

Club Foot: Club Foot is a common congenital disease in India afflicting approximately 75,000 children every year. Our Club donated Rs. 1.25 lakhs towards Club Foot surgeries during 2020-21. The same amount was matched by St. Stephens Patients Welfare Association. Many thanks to Mrs. Anuradha Goel, the Chairperson. With this amount a total of 25 surgeries will be performed at a subsidized rate of Rs. 10,000 per surgery. We are into the seventh year of our support for Club Foot Surgeries. Our Club contributed Rs. 2.0 lakhs, Rs. 1.50 lakhs, Rs. 2.00 lakhs and Rs. 3.00 lacs in the years 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2018-19 respectively. In 2013-14 our Club donated Rs. 3.50 lakhs for Polio Corrective surgeries.

WinS& WASH & Toilet Renovation / Up-gradation at SDMC Schools

The key initiatives of District 3011 are “WinS”/ WASH in schools. This project has taken center stage in Rotary as many clubs of the district have been adopting it. It includes building clean toilets and group hand washing stations, providing cleaning materials and teaching children when and how to wash hands properly. With the improved conditions in hygiene, it is expected that there would be a decrease in the number of days children miss school because of illness and an increase in their overall attendance. Girls, on attaining puberty, need no longer miss school as gender specific toilets ensure that they can maintain hygienic practices in safety and privacy. These children will be the agents of change in the SWACHH BHARAT SWACHH VIDYALAYA campaign. We have been supporting this campaign for the past six years and have done tremendous work in this area.

This year we renovated toilet block (Both Girls & Boys) at SDMC School CR Park, with a budget of Rs. 11.00 lacs under CSR funds from Hughes.

In **2015-16**, thanks to the support received from Angelique Foundation and HCIL Comtel Ltd., we spent over Rs. 45 lakhs on the project by building 51 WC's, 24 urinals, 31 hand wash stations with 135 taps in MCD School, Srinivaspuri, Anand Vihar, Tigri 1, 2 and 3 and Kendra Vidyalaya, RK Puram.

In **2016-17** we spent over Rs. 51 lakhs on the renovation and construction of toilets and hand

wash facilities - 60 WC's, 36 urinals and 26 hand wash stations with 96 taps in MCD School, Kalkaji, MCD School No. 1, 2 and 3 Tigri, Ambedkar Nagar benefitting over 3500 children and staff members.

In **2017-18** we constructed 42 WC's, 11 urinals and hand wash stations with 47 taps at a total expense of Rs. 31 lakhs benefitting over 3200 children and staff members.

In **2018-19** we renovated/ constructed 21 WC's, 6 urinals, hand wash stations with 22 taps and a septic tank at a total expense of Rs. 26 lakhs benefitting over 1200 children and staff members.

We thank Mr. Pranav Roach, CEO Hughes Network for his valuable support with CSR funds of Hughes Network System India Ltd. The HCIL partnership is in its 5th year. We also thank Rtn. Sanjeev Nangia for his continued support in the execution of the toilet projects.

Baas Educational Trust School, Tikli Village, Gurgaon, Haryana: Guided by our Club's PP Martin Howard, the Baas Educational Trust seeks to bring an English medium education to children of three villages near Gurgaon using the Montessori System of teaching by specially trained teachers. We have been providing support to this school since 2007.

Kulachi Hansraj Model School (KHMS) Interact Club:

Our Interact Club continues to shine as one of the leading Interact Clubs in RI District 3011. They have actively participated in DILA and other District programs held online. This year due to the lockdown, the energy level of Interacts was down and they continued their activities from home. We are proud to be associated with such a wonderful Interact Club. We are thankful to the principal, Mrs. Sneh Verma for her cooperation. We also thank their teachers Mrs. Seema Lal, Ms. Ritu and Ms. Aditi for their efforts and guidance in getting the students to be so actively involved.

Rotaract Club of Ashoka University, jointly hosted by our Club and Rotary Club of Sonapat, Midtown, is a relatively new club but is actively involved with Balgram. The students visited it from time to time and helped us conduct the health camps.

12th Annual Inter School Debate in association with Kulachi Hansraj Interact Club –

It was our 12th Annual Debate held on 27th & 28th October. It was a very successful and well-attended Online Debate. We had 42 Schools participating from India and Abroad. And engaged in 70 Debates conducted on Asian Parliamentary principles. Our PP Rtn. Vivek Katariya had been instrumental in organising this event right from its inception along with his very enthusiastic and hardworking Team and took the Debate to a different level.

The Inaugural Session started with an address by the President. It was very well attended besides our members by the dignitaries from the District and other Office Bearers. Our DG Anup Mittal ji was our Chief Guest who gave us a very inspiring Speech.

Our very special thanks once again to our Debating Committee Chair PP Rtn Vivek Katariya and Rtn. G Deepika Venkatesh for organizing a wonderful show. We also thanks to our Rtn. Deepak Mittal; Rtn. Manorma Gogia & Rtn. Ashok Sharma who has contributed for the debate.
