Rotary Club of Delhi Garden City

An affiliate of Rotary International, Rotary Club of Delhi Garden City(RCDGC) was chartered in 1989. It is one of the Elite club in Rotary District 3011 and one of the most active in Delhi/NCR area in Health, Education and Skill Development areas.

RCDGC has been actively serving the community since 1989, by managing successful community service projects as well as contributing to Rotary International's key initiatives – Polio Eradication and Blood Donation. The club has the organizational and process maturity to not only sustain its community service projects (some of which have been in operation since 1999), but also initiate new projects from time to time. Since 1989 we have worked with a number of Rotary Clubs worldwide and with several partner and affiliate organizations to execute our community service projects. We take great pride in the transparency of our operations and publish our accounts and project report annually on our website.

During 35 years of its existence, RCDGC has successfully collaborated for several impactful projects. Our Club started a Comprehensive Vision Care Center in a slum area in association with Dr Shroff's Charity Eye Hospital. This year we also initated Cervical Cancer Eradication Program with support from 'District 3011' and 'The Cancer Foundation'. Added another feature in the cap by starting Rehabilitation and Capicity Building centre for special children at South Extn. In health area, it includes complete renovation and upgradation of the Orthopedic OPD at St Stpehens Hospital, Delhi; setting up Dialysis Center at Rotary Hospital, Gurgaon, associating with Club foot surgery and with children eye surgery on continuous basis for last 10 years.

Under Skill Development, we have been running 3 sewing Centers for several years with Singer as the knowledge and resource partner. These Centers have been empowering the young women and housewives to have independent income source and contribute to their family's welfare. Till July 2023, we have skilled 25 women in South Delhi, Noida and Gurugram slum areas. We also started working in Digital Skill Development area by setting up an IT Center at Rani Bagh, Delhi in 52 . it has skilled youth in IT skills till june 2024

We further enhanced our engagement in Skill Development Area by setting up a Digital and Employment Skill Development Center at South Delhi, with NIIT Foundation as the knowledge partner. This Center aims at Skilling the 12th pass slum youth and help them in getting suitable employment. The Center helps about 60 youth every year by skilling them in Digital and various functional areas- Accounting, Sales, supply chain etc.

In Education area, we have been running a Balwadi since 1999 to prepare 50 children of slum areas per year, for admission into regular schools. This covers pre school education, mid day meal and regular health check up for the children. We also work with MCD schools for improving the infrastructure and education facilities of these school. In last 15 years, we have collaborated with 27 Schools for improving toilet

facilities, clean drinking water facilities, e-class room, liabrary, art rooms, computer center, medical and first aid facilities etc.

Being a part of Rotary International, we actively support and service programs such as Polio National Immunization Days (NIDs), Cancer Foundation, Education Foundation and Rotary Blood Bank, to name a few. Rotary Blood Bank in Delhi and Rotary Cancer Institute at All India Institute of Medical Sciences are among the internationally-known examples of the Community Service projects undertaken by Rotary movement.

SUMMARY OF CLUB ACTIVITIES 2023-24

Throughout the year, our club has undertaken and expanded several impactful projects, benefiting numerous individuals across different communities. The Skill Development Centre, initiated during our Silver Jubilee, now operates in three locations—South Extension Part 2, Noida, and Gurugram—empowering women from economically weaker sections. This year, 25 girls completed the sewing course, with many now earning 8,000-10,000 INR per month. The IT Skill Development Center in Rani Bagh has provided basic computer training to 32 youths, with 14 currently enrolled. The Basti Vikas Kendra School in Srinivaspuri continues to support 55 children of daily laborers with education, meals, and medical check-ups. Our new Digital & Employment Skill Development Centre in partnership with NIIT Foundation has seen remarkable success, with students gaining skills and securing diverse placements in prestigious organizations. The 14th Annual Inter-school Extempore English Debate was another highlight, fostering critical thinking among students from 24 elite schools. Our Annual Golf Tournament promoted international goodwill while raising funds for community service projects. The Pulse Polio & End Polio Drive remains a cornerstone, with our club actively participating in National Immunization Days. Additionally, new projects like the Comprehensive Vision Care Centre in collaboration with Dr. Shroff's Charitable Eye Hospital and the Rehabilitation and Capacity Building Program for Special Children have been launched, addressing critical healthcare and educational needs. Our club also joined the Cervical Cancer Elimination Drive, vaccinating numerous girls to prevent the disease. These initiatives reflect our commitment to making a tangible difference in our community.

The Rotary Club of Delhi Garden City has been involved in a number of community service projects. In 2023-24, we not only sustained these ongoing projects but launched a number of new initiatives. A brief of these projects and initiatives can be found below:

SUMMARY OF COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS

Ongoing Projects

Skill Development Centre (Singer Sewing Centre)

This project, started in our Silver Jubilee year, caters to the women in the economically weaker section of society. We are running three RCDGC Skill Development Centre's

- C-63, (Basement), South Extension Part 2, New Delhi 110049 (Since 2015)
- H. No 88, Sec 15 A, Noida, UP 201301 (Since 2019)
- Om Vihar, Sector 7, Gurugram (April 2021)

During the year 25 no of girls completed their certification of the Sewing course. In addition, 32 girls are undergoing the training. After completion of the certification, most of the girls are able to earn 8-10,000/- per month thru different avenues.



IT Skill Development Center:

Started at Rani Bagh, west Delhi, in Dec 2021, this 9-seater Computer training center imparts basic computer training to weaker section groups around the Center. It runs a 6 months training program with 2 hour every day. It has trained 32 nos of youth since its inception and has 14 no of youth undergoing training presently.

Basti Vikas Kendra School, Srinivaspuri, Delhi

This pre-nursery, inaugurated in 1999, is situated on the periphery of a big slum in



Srinivaspuri in the heart of South Delhi. Children of casual daily laborers leave their 3–6-year-old children in the school for a full day's care. Children are provided primary education, mid-day meal, uniforms, toys, medical checkup, etc. The school is also equipped with sports equipment for the children. There are 55 children in this Balwadi. Members celebrate their birthdays

and anniversaries on a Monthly basis at the Balwadi which enhances Members engagement with the project.

Digital & Employment Skill Development Centre:

This year we started Digital & Employment Soft Skills Development Centre at South Extn. in association with NIIT Foundation as Knowledge partner. Project aims to prepare up to 96 Children p.a. from EWS category ready for employment for various job profiles and then get them suitably employed with reputed business entities.



It has been a dynamic and a very successful year, with significant milestones and achievements to celebrate.

Completion of the Course for 2 Batches

- Career Edge Program Completion: We're delighted to announce that we have successfully completed 2 Batches of the Career Edge Program. Our students have demonstrated exceptional dedication and hard work throughout the course.
- ➤ **English for Job**: The 'English for Job' module progress has been impressive. Students have not only enhanced their language skills but also gained valuable insights into effective communication in professional settings.
- Career Options Exploration: Industry experts provided invaluable insights into various career options, enriching the students' understanding of potential paths in their respective fields.
- > **Students Activities:** A highlight of this quarter was the Group Presentation by our students, showcasing their collaborative skills and subject knowledge.

Diverse and Noteworthy Placements:

All students opting for jobs from Batch 1were successfully placed across various industries, including Big Four Audit firms, Hotels, Hospitals, Office Equipment companies, and Luxury Retail. Six students underwent specialized training in the Hospitality Industry. Thanks to Mr. Rohit Bhatia of RIG Institute of Hospitality & Management and were subsequently placed at Le-Meridian Hotel. Three students secured positions at Ernst & Young,



a global financial powerhouse. Four students were selected by DHLI Hospital for training in medical services. Infres Methodex, Puri's International, and NIIT Foundation also welcomed DESDC graduates into their folds. We are pleased to share that the 2nd Batch at DESDC, completed the course of BFSI is completed and 12 students have got the placement at MyMoneyMantra.com. 3 students got place with East West Rescue Medical care.

Selection process for New Batch:

- > **Student profile:** For the new batch, we are target 12th pass students aged 18 and above, especially those from economically weaker sections.
- > **Selection Process:** Our meticulous selection process includes home visits, written tests, parent interactions, candidate interviews, family interviews, and thorough background checks.

Program Overview:

➤ **Integrated Program:** Our Integrated Program encompasses Digital Skills, Functional Skills, Employment Skills, and Industry Exposure, ensuring a holistic development approach.

Digital Skills: Comprehensive training in MS Office, Data Entry, and Typing.

Functional Skills: Two independent streams – Accounts (including Tally and Tax Laws) and BFSI (Banking, Financial Services, and Insurance).

Employment Skills: Focus on Spoken English and Soft Skills, including effective communication and interpersonal relations.

Industry Exposure: Regular industry visits and interactions with executives.

▶ Digital Health Assistant: An independent program tailored for aspiring Digital Health Assistants includes training in Electronic Health Records, Telemedicine software, Front Office Management, and Basic Clinical Procedures, including CPR and Emergency Management.



We aim to provide a comprehensive understanding of job opportunities and skill requirements through industry interfaces. As we continue to grow and evolve, we look forward to more success stories, partnerships, and shared achievements at DESDC. Thank you for your ongoing support and commitment to excellence.

<u>Annual Inter-school Extempore English Debate</u>

Our 14th Annual Debate held on 28th & 29th August 2023. This year we again held a very successful and a well-attended Debating competition, where the preliminary rounds were held on Day 1 and the Semis & Finals were



held on Day 2 at IIC. We had 24 Elite Schools participating from Delhi & NCR and a school from Chandigarh. These debates were conducted on Asian Parliamentary principles

Annual Golf Tournament

The **Annual International Goodwill Golf Invitational** is a unique event organized by the **Rotary Club of Delhi Garden City** since 1992 to promote International Friendship, Understanding and Peace - one of Rotary's core focus areas.

This annual event is held at the **Delhi Golf Club** and brings together Ambassadors/High Commissioners, Corporate Leaders and RC Delhi Garden City members playing a round of golf to raise money for our Community Service Projects and to promote International Goodwill. The International Goodwill Golf Invitational is followed by a lunch and prize distribution ceremony, hosted at the residence of our own member Rtn. Ravina Khurana & Mukul Wasnik.



Pulse Polio & End Polio Drive

Rotary has dedicated itself to worldwide eradication of Polio due largely to Rotary's efforts; India was declared polio free by the WHO in February 2014. Our Club RCDGC continues to actively participate in the Polio plus National Immunization Days (NID's) in Delhi where we are responsible for logistics support in the area. In the past seven years, our Club has been allotted two booths, one at Hamid Poly Clinic, Batla House, Okhla and another at Lions Hospital, Khijrabad. On NID/SNIDs our members visited both localities, going house to house encouraging parents to bring their children to the booths for vaccination. Plastic balls, caps, chocolate, biscuits etc. were distributed to motivate the children and increase the turnout. Members monitored the booths and administered polio drops.

New Projects started during this year

Comprehensive Vision Care Centre with Dr. Shroff's Charitable Eye Hospital (SCEH)

We are pleased to share that the Comprehensive Vision Centre was opened on 22nd



January at Madanpur Khadar village, Near Sarita Vihar & Badarpur Border. Inauguration was held in presence of DG Rtn. Jeetender Gupta and other District Dignitaries and members of our Club. This Centre will not only conduct door-to-door eye checks but also raise awareness about the importance of eye care within the community. The key features for the project are as under:

- Door-to-Door visits: Technicians conducting door-to-door visits in the community to check the eyes of children for identifying patients who need eye care
- **State of the Art Eye Checkup:** The Centre is equipped with the latest machines, and ensures a thorough eye examination.
- Cataract Eye Surgeries: Patients requiring cataract eye surgeries are referred to Dr. Shroff Hospital, Daryaganj for their eye's surgeries, addressing a critical need in our community.
- **Free Spectacles for Children:** At the Centre we ensure that children receive the free specs as they need for a brighter future.
- **Economical Spectacles for Elders:** We are also providing affordable specs for the elderly from the Centre.

Rehabilitation and Capacity Building Program for Special Children

This year we also setup the 'Rehabilitation and Capacity Building Program for Special Children with A Giggles Welfare Organization' at South Delhi for the benefit of underprivileged population. The key features for the project are as under:



A state of art rehabilitation centre with sufficient amount of facilities under the following provisions:

- Advance Medical Equipment for therapies.
- Timely therapies to prevent permanent disability.
- Facility to ensure holistic development of children in still in them a sense of self-reliance.
- Vocational skills training to equip them with essential skills
- Special education to ensure basic life skills for the children.
- Early intervention centre, free consultation and screening expected to address the ailment in the early Stages.
- Free transport & nutrition meal to ensure attendance of the registered patients.

Capacity building of parents of children disability:

- Enable them to better deal with the child at home.
- Facilitate families for certificates & pensions of their differently abled children.
- Education to families about specific disabilities, provisions, govt. schemes & policies and how to avail the benefits.
- Personalized support for the families with disabled children.

We have also applied for the Global Grant towards the Operational Cost for the Centre for next 3-4 years and hope soon it will be cleared.

Elimination Drive Cervical Cancer

Likewise Polio, this year our District also worked on the eradicating risk of Cervical Cancer. Under the guidance of AG Rtn. Vandana Bhalla, who is also District Chair for Cervical Cancer Elimination Drive, our Club also joined hands to support the cause. Under this program girls from the age of 9 – 16 were given two shot of Vaccination, which will eliminate the possibility of Cervical Cancer for the life.

We held 1st dose of camp at Balwantrai Mehta Balwantray Mehta Vidya Bhawan, Lajpat Bhawan and Vaccinated 140 girls from BMVB School and DAV School, Vasant Kunj. After 6 months, we held camp for 2nd dose at Balwantray Mehta Vidya Bhawan, Lajpat Bhawan and Vaccinated 179 girls from BMVB School, DAV School, Vasant Kunj. During the camp for 2nd Dose the first round of vaccinations was provided to 36 girls from Saksham



Camp, Coolie Colony. The second dose will be administered after 5-6 months.

We also conducted at 1st dose of camp at Shaheed Bishan Singh Memorial Senior Secondary School, and vaccinated 166 girls.

An awareness session was also conducted with girls and their parents before the scheduling of vaccination camp at both of the above mentioned schools. Apart from these schools, we also conducted awareness session at Kulachi Hansraj Model School, Ashok Vihar – Ph III and BR Ambedkar Vidhyalaya, Dakshin puri, but didn't find numbers to organize a vaccination drive.

Other Projects:

Annual Maintainance of Water Filteration Plants: We received contributions from M/s DP World – Nhava Sheva (India) Gateway Terminal Pvt. Ltd., Indica Industries Pvt. Ltd and M/s Ummeed Housing Finance Pvt Ltd for maintaining water filtration plants at 11 MCD schools, ensuring clean and safe drinking water for the children

Blood Donation Camps: During the year, we held 3 Blood Donation Camps and collected 140 units of Blood.

Swatchchta Pakhwada: Celebrated Swatchchta Pakhwada with the children of the SDMC School, Nehru Nagar in association with HPCL. Held a drawing and painting competition with the theme Cleanliness and distributed Drawing books, Color kits & Goodies Bag

Tree Plantation: We held 3 programs of Tree Plantation in association with RWA A1 Block Janakpuri, and planted more than 350 trees in 4 different parks maintained by RWA. We also donated Hedge-cutting Machine to the RWA for the maintenances of these parks.

Cycle Distributions: 20 cycles were distributed to the EWS girl's students of Govt. Co-Ed Sarvodaya Vidyalaya, Bamnoli, in association with Rotary Club of Delhi Govinda. Our club contributed for 13 cycles. Thanks to the members for their generous support.

Swings at Nehru BAL Samiti BAL Vidyalaya: Under CSR funds from Ace Hardware Pvt. Ltd., we upgraded the playground and installed new swings at NBS Vidyalaya.

Floods Relief: Members contributed generously towards the support for providing meals at the flood affected area at Sec 126, Noida. The food for around 500 people was distributed for 12 days by AGWO. Sanitary Pads were also distributed to the adolescent girls at the flood affected area. Relief was also given for Animal Rescue.

Health Camp: We started the new Rotary Year with a Health Camp which was held on 2nd July, in association with Fortis Hospital & Sewa Bharti. Facilities like ECG, BP, Sugar, Dental care and Eye Check up were available and 32 people in the community were screened.

Another Health Camp was organized in association with Delhi Heart & Lungs Institute (DHLI) at Sri Gurudwara Sahib, Pushp Vihar on 18th May. Facilities like ECG, BP, Sugar, PFT – Lungs, Dietician were available and 77 people in the community were screened.

Project under Consideration

Renovation & Upgrading at St. Stephens Hospital

St Stephens hospital has shared the details about their plans to renovate the Other OPDs in the Hospital which includes Pediatric OPD, General Medicine OPD, Skin care OPD and the area surrounding all these and the Ortho OPD.

The total cost of all the OPDs renovation is estimated at Rs 1 crs. This can be taken up in phases over a period.

Upgradation and renovation of the Pediatric OPD which treats children of low-income families around the hospital. This is expected to cost about Rs 25 lacs and will be completed in 3 months from the date of start.

Upgradation and renovation of the General medicine OPD which treats all the other ailments for everyone. Expected to cost about Rs 25 lacs and will take about 4-5 months.

Upgradation and renovation of Skin care OPD and other general area: Rs 25 lacs

Renovation of the Toilet block which serves the Ortho OPD, Pediatric OPD and Medicines OPD. Expected to Cost about Rs 25 lacs

Our Signifiant Past Projects:

E-Learning Equipment: **E-Classrooms**: Rotary International launched an initiative to eradicate another demon from our society '**Illiteracy**'.Rotary took this initiative under its flagship mission **T-E-A-C-H** that aims to ensure basic education for under privileged children across India.

The five pillars of **Rotary's LiteracyMission** are:

- T Teacher Support
- E E-Learning for School Children
- A Adult Literacy
- C Child Development
- H Happy Schools

Out of these five pillars, District 3011 had undertaken **E-Learning** to ensure the optimum use of technology to remove **Illiteracy** from our country and launched Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM). Our club supported this program with a contribution of Rs. 15.00 lacs. The funds for the same were donated under CSR funds by M/s (give the name of the company)

Support for autistic children at Tamana, School of Hope: Our Club have been supporting Tamanafor many years. In year 2019-20 we supported to set up of waste paper recycling unit at a cost of Rs. 10.00 lacs. The program enables the differently abled children to realize their full potential, instills self confidence in them and helps in their social and economic integration. This project was supported by M/s Ace Hardware P Ltd.

In previous years our Club supported *Tamana* and built an occupational/physiotherapy room at a cost of Rs. 5.00 lakhs. Prior to that we contributed Rs. 2.50 lakhs to build an *auditorium* and in year 2016-17 club contributed Rs. 4.65 lakhs for a sensory room for the autistic children at the Autism Centre.

Project Prakash: This project funds surgery of children who have defective vision since childbirth. In association with *Dr. Shroff Charity Eye Hospital*, surgeries are performed at a subsidized rate of Rs. 20,000/- per eye. Our Club has been involved with *Project Prakash* since 2013-14 and has contributed Rs 21 lacs so far for this noble project. We are thankful to all the donors for their generous contribution for this cause.

Club Foot: Club Foot is a common congenital disease in India afflicting large number of children every year. Our Club has been supporting this project since 2013-14 in association with St Stpehens Hospital, New Delhi by enabling free surgeries/treatment of this child disability. We have contributed Rs 13.25 lacs for this project over the period, thanks to our generous donors for this cause.

WinS& WASH & Toilet Renovation / Up-gradation at SDMC Schools

Under the Swachh Bharat Mission, Rotary District 3011 adopted in 2015-16, the Swachh vidhyalaya mission for augmenting the toilets and hand wash facilities at MCD Schools and promoting good hygiene practices amongst the Children. Our club actively participated in this mission and contributed to builing:

- Toilets facilities for boys and girls in 16 Schools
- Hand washing stations in 18 Schools

The club spent about Rs 1.64 crs over 5 years for this project which benefited 26 schools and about 26,000+ children every year.

Hughes Network System India Ltd. Was the principle CSR partner for this project and contributed generously for the same..

Baas Educational Trust School, Tikli Village, Gurgaon, Haryana: Guided by our Club's PP Martin Howard, the Baas Educational Trust seeks to bring an English medium education to children of three villages near Gurgaon using the Montessori System of teaching by specially trained teachers. We supported the setting up and the operaring expenses of this school till it became self sufficient.

NEW GENERATION / YOUTH SERVICE
