Basti Vikas Kendra – Srinivaspuri

Started in 1999, daily labourers leave their 3-6year old children in the Balwadi for a full day's care where we provide primary education, mid-day meals, uniforms, toys, medical checkups, etc.

The batch comprises of 50-60 students every year from nearby slum areas.

The Club meets all the expenses involved for teachers, maids/cooks as well as teaching supplies and sports goods for children and infrastructure improvement.







Skill Development - Sewing Centres

Our Club is running 3 Sewing and Tailoring training centres in association with Singer India Ltd. two of these have been running for almost 7-8 years. The third one is two years old.



The centres are located in Noida, South Extension and Gurugram.

A Diploma certificate is provided by Singer after six months of training to the women in the economically weaker sections of society, so that the women can earn a livelihood.

The Centres train about 40-45 girls of upto 18 years of age every year.

We have also started training them on Industrial Sewing machines to make them ready for employment, if they choose to seek that.





Digital & Employment Soft Skills Development Centre



RCDGC has set up a Digital & Employment Soft Skills Development Centre at South Extension. in association with NIIT Foundation.

The aim and object of this project is to make Children from the Economical Weaker Section of the Society equipped with such skills which will provide them with job opportunity in different corporate houses of repute. Presently the Centre caters to 40 Children and with the capacity to upgrade 80 Children.Besides digital skills, the curriculum includes communication and presentation skills, work behaviour, corporate culture and other soft skills.

Besides the above Centre the Club runs several Computer and IT Skill Development Centres at various locations in association with local Non-Government Organizations.





Clean Drinking Water in MCD Schools

Another hallmark project undertaken since 2016-17 is to provide clean drinking water to children.

Our Club has installed Water Filtration plants in 11 schools benefitting over 6,000 children and staff at the cost of Rs. 55 lacs.

These water filtration plants are being maintained by the Club under an AMC.







Our Projects - Making a Difference Blindness & Vision Care

WHO estimates suggest that between 200,000 and 700,000 children in India suffer from potentially treatable forms of blindness, such as cataract or corneal opacities.

Our club has been actively supporting surgeries for treating congenital blindness since 2013 by sponsoring subsidized surgeries for children at the Dr. Shroff's Charity Hospital in Delhi throughout of initiative Project Prakash. Over the years, we have helped nearly 100 children by restoring their eyesight.

We have also set up a Vison Care Centre in a South Delhi slum. The Centre encourages parents to bring their children for screening and a comprehensive checkup. The critical cases are thereafter referred to Dr. Shroff's Charitable Eye Hospital at Daryaganj. The Club provides affordable spectacles for the elderly through this initiative.









Our Projects - Making a Difference Annual Inter School Debating Competition

We are into our 15th year of organizing an Annual Inter School Debate Competition, in association with our Interact Club of Kulachi Hansraj Model School. It has become the most awaited event for Delhi Schools. We are back to physical debating competitions after running successful online debates for two years, due to covid disturbances.



Elite schools from Delhi & NCR participate in the competition and debates are conducted on Asian Parliamentary principles.







Our Projects - Making a Difference Rehabilitation Centre - Special Children

Renovation and upgradation of a state-of-the-art centre for special children in South Delhi . This aims to provide total care to 40 special children with physical, speech and learning disability. For the benefit of the underprivileged population with sufficient amount of facilities under the following provisions:

- Advanced Medical Equipment for therapies.
- Timely therapies to prevent permanent disability.
- Facility to ensure holistic development of children and instill in them a sense of self-reliance.
 - Special education to ensure basic life skills for the children.
- Early intervention centre, free consultation and screening expected to address the ailment in the early stages.
- Free transport & nutritious meals to ensure attendance of the registered patients.

CAPACITY BUILDING OF PARENTS

• Enable them to deal better with the child at home.

- Facilitate families for certificates & pensions of their differently abled children.
- Education to families about specific disabilities, provisions, govt. schemes & policies and how to avail the benefits.
 - Personalized support for the families with disabled children.





Our Projects - Making a Difference Cervical Cancer Vaccination Drive



Cervical Cancer is a cancer of the female reproductive tract develops in the cervix of a female. Cervical Cancer usually develops slowly over time with initial appearance of abnormal cells in the cervical tissue. Later, cancer cells start to grow and spread more deeply into the cervix and to surrounding areas.

Cervical Cancer Vaccination Drives is held at schools and our target audience is girl students from the Economical Weaker Section of the Society.

We administer Cervavac vaccine, approved by WHO-IACR,BMGF, DBT-BIRAC, CDC. in two doses, 6 months apart, to girls age group of 9 to 18 years.





Our Projects - Making a Difference Club Foot



Club foot is a congenital birth defect in which a foot, in some cases both feet, grow inwards. Patients learn to walk on the side of the foot. It is probably the second or third cause of physical disability in India, after road traffic accidents and trauma. It's more of a cosmetic problem initially. As they grow older and they find that they can no longer play with their friends,

that's when it starts sinking in that this is a functional problem as well. Around 75,000 children are born in India with Club feet. Our Club has been supporting Club Foot surgeries since 2013.

All our contributions are matched by the St. Stephens Hospital Patients Welfare Association which doubles the impact of contributions from RCDGC members.
