RCDGC has been actively serving the community since 1989 by managing a number of successful community service projects, as well as contributing to Rotary International's key initiatives – Polio Eradication and Blood Donation. The club has the organizational and process maturity to not only sustain its community service projects (some of which have been in operation since 1999), but also initiate new pilot projects from time to time. Since 1989 we work with a number of Rotary Clubs worldwide and with several partner and affiliate organizations to execute our community service projects. We take great pride in the transparency of our operations and publish our accounts and project report annually on our web site

Being a part of Rotary International, we actively support and service programs, such as - Polio Plus drive, Cancer Foundation, Education Foundation, Youth Exchange Program, Ambassadorial Scholarships, Rotary Blood Bank, to name a few. Rotary Blood Bank in Delhi and Rotary Cancer Institute at All India Institute of Medical Sciences are among the internationally known examples of the Community Service projects undertaken by Rotary movement.





ONGOING PROJECTS

Basti Vikas Kendra - Srinivaspuri

Started in 1999, daily labourers leave their 3-6year old children in the Balwadi for a full day's care where we provide primary education, mid-day meal, uniforms, toys, medical checkups etc.

The batch comprises of 50-60 students every year from nearby slum areas

The Club meets all the expenses involved for teachers, maids/cooks as well as teaching supplies and sports good for children and infrastructure improvement









Skill Development- Sewing Centres

Our Club is running three Sewing and Tailoring training centres in association with Singer India Ltd. Two of these are running for almost 7-8 years. The third one is two years old.

The centres are located in Noida, South Ex and Gurugram

A Diploma certificate is provided by Singer after six months of training to the women in the economically weaker section of society, so that woman can earn their livelihood.

The Centres train every year about 40-45 girls of upto 18 years of age.

We have also started training them on Industrial Sewing machines to make them ready for employment, if they choose to seek that.

Besides, sewing, we are also training them on spoken English and work related behaviour.





Skill Development- IT Skills

The Club started an IT skills development Center at Rani Bagh, Delhi. It has 10 computers donated by one of our member

It trains upto 30 students in three batches with the basic computer skills including the Microsoft office bouquet.

The place is provided by another NGO









DIGITAL & EMPLOYMENT SOFT SKILLS DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Set up Digital & Employment Soft Skills Development Centre at South Extn. in association with NIIT Foundation. Project aims to prepare upto 80 Children p.a. from EWS category ready for employment for various job profiles and then get them suitably employed with reputed business entities. Besides digital skills, the curriculum includes communication and presentation skills, work behaviour, corporate culture, and other soft skills.









Clean Drinking Water in MCD Schools

Another hallmark project undertaken in 2016-17 was to provide clean drinking water to the children.

Club have installed Water Filtration plants in 11 schools benefitting over 6,000 children and staff at the cost of Rs. 55 lacs.

These water filtration plants are being maintained by the Club under AMC









Club Foot Surgery

St Stephens Hospital, civil lines, Delhi has one of the biggest and most successful charitable club foot support program.

Our club has been associated with this since 2014 supporting with annual contribution for meeting the running expenses and for capacity enhancement.

In 2022 we supported we supported a complete renovation and upgradation of the Ortho OPD at a cost of Rs. 40.00 lacs

In addition we support the operating expenses on annual basis with matching contribution with St. Stephens Patients Welfare Association

Club has so far donated Rs. 16.25 lacs for this project

Project Prakash - Dr Shroff's Charitable Eye Hospital

Project Prakash: has been working since 2013 for strengthening vision care through treatment of Vision impairments including Congenial Eye surgeries of children suffering eye defect since birth to prevent from blindness. Has spent Rs 15 lacs for this project and contributed to improving vision care for about 150 children.













COMPREHENSIVE VISION CARE CENTRE

A step aim at enhancing our engagement with Project Prakash further. This project will provide total eye care to children in a slum area in south Delhi.

Mode of Operations:

To set up a Vision Center in a slum area.

Provide basic eye check and eye care facilities and Specs

To have 3-4 Screeners who will carry out house to house visit and carry out eye check

To pursue with the family to visit the Vision Center for the required eye care.

Parents would be encouraged to bring their children under 5 years of age to the nearby vision centre for screening using a photo screener.

Based on the detailed check up eye care at Vision Center, provide facilities for surgery at SCEH, Daryaganj







ANNUAL INTER SCHOOL DEBATING COMPETITION

We are into 14th year of organizing Annual Inter School Debate Competition in association with our Interact club of 'Kulachi Hansraj Model School. It has become the most awaited program for the Schools. We were back to physical debating competition after running successful Online Debate for two years, due to covid disturbances.

Elite schools from Delhi & NCR participate in the competition and debates are conducted on Asian Parliamentary principles.









PROJECTS UNDER IMPLEMENTATION

REHAB CENTRE - SPECIAL CHILDREN

Renovation and upgradation to state of art centre for special children at South Delhi Aims at providing total care to 40 special children with physical; speech and learning disability to the benefit of underprivileged population with sufficient amount of facilities under the following provisions:

Advance Medical Equipment for therapies.

Timely therapies to prevent permanent disability.

Facility to ensure holistic development of children in still in them a sense of self-reliance.

Vocational skills training to equip them with essential skills

Special education to ensure basic life skills for the children.

Early intervention centre, free consultation and screening expected to address the ailment in the early Stages.

Free transport & nutrition meal to ensure attendance of the registered patients.

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CAPACITY BUILDING OF PARENTS OF CHILDREN DISABILITY:

Enable them to better deal with the child at home.

Facilitate families for certificates & pensions of their differently abled children.

Education to families about specific disabilities, provisions, govt. schemes & policies and how to avail the benefits.

Personalized support for the families with disabled children.





UPGRADATION OF PLAYGROUND AT NBS SCHOOL

Founded in 1963 by Mr. S.P. Govil, Nehru Bal Samiti (NBS) is a registered non-profit organization working for the welfare, education, and empowerment of underprivileged children, youth, and women in urban India

PLAY GROUND - EXISTING

The existing playground is a 1400 sq ft, hard surface ground, on the east side of the class block. Though being a good size, It lacks any playground equipment, and often results in injuries due to its hard, paved flooring. And lacking and play equipment, naturally results in a high reticence to play, by the children.

Playing stimulates the child's brain to develop various motor skills like writing, jumping, walking, detailed handwork, planning, and making good decisions. And it is proposed to buy and install a comprehensive playground equipment, and soft flooring, for a safer and better all round experience for the children.

PLAY GROUND - AS PLANNED

Our refurbish of the playground will upgrade this to a modern, safe, enjoyable and maintainable facility. This will go a long way in bringing in a cultural and societal change in the school children and their family and the well being quotient, but will also increase the girl child's education, participation and inclusiveness. Providing a proper playground is beneficial to keep the children fit and healthy. School playground with safe and enjoyable equipment positively impacts children's emotional, social, physical, and mental growth. Various other advantages include increased self-esteem, critical thinking skills, and a strong immune system.





RENOVATION/ UPGRADATION AT ST. STEPHENS HOSPITAL

St. Stephens Hospital: This is the oldest non govt hospital in Delhi, run by charitable organization and caters to low income families in and around its location. The Hospital is one of the most trusted by patients for its caring and genuine medical care across all disciplines. The building and equipment are very old and require support for upgradation and renovation so that it could cater to larger number of patients and provide the best medical care. We have identified the following projects for immediate take up:

PEDIATRIC OPD - Upgradation and renovation of the Paediatric OPD which treats children of low income families around the hospital. This is expected to cost about Rs 25 lacs and will be completed in 3 months from the date of start.

MEDICAL OPD - Upgradation and renovation of the General medicine OPD which treats all the other ailments for every one. Expected to cost about Rs 25 lacs and will take about 4-5 months

TOILETS BLOCK - Renovation of the Toilet block which serves the Ortho OPD, Paediatric OPD and Medicines OPD. Expected to Cost about Rs 15 lacs





CERVICVAL CANCER VACCINATION DRIVE

Cervical Cancer Vaccination Drive will be held at school and our target audience will be girls' students from EWS

We will be providing Cervavac vaccine, an Indian Vaccine which is developed by Serum Institute through global collaboration with agencies like WHO-IACR, BMGF, DBT-BIRAC, CDC

The above-mentioned dose will be administered in 2 parts i.e. 0 & 6 months to the girls from the age group 9-14 years

During a One vaccination drive around vaccination to 100 girls will be provided.
